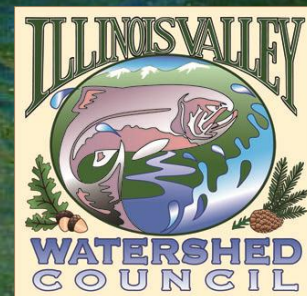
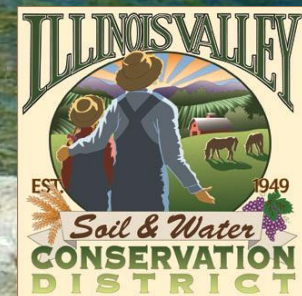

## IMPROVING OUR RESOURCES

The Illinois Valley Watershed Council works to accomplish our mission by:

## GETTING INVOLVED

As a landowner in a priority watershed, please consider working with your neighbors to develop a project or plan that enhances natural resources in your little "piece of the watershed."

Some of the projects you may consider include:

- Planting along stream banks to slow erosion
- Developing off-stream livestock watering facilities
- Fencing stream areas to control livestock use
- Off-channel alcoves to improve fish habitat
- Reseeding old logging roads
- Installing alternatives to gravel push-up dams or other in-stream structures

**Funding and assistance through the Watershed Health Program may be available on a cost-share basis that may include materials or labor**
